Men's Health Network encourages families to give the gift of health for Father's Day

June 11, 2001 – Washington, DC. Instead of giving your father another tie or a book – take him to the doctor for his yearly health screening. Chances are, whether it be your father, husband, uncle, nephew or son, he's hasn't seen his doctor in over year. In fact, fewer than one in five men said they would seek immediate medical care if they were sick or in pain. This alarming state of mind leads to increased rates of mortality for men for all of the top 10 leading causes of death.

National Men's Health Week provides a direct opportunity to reach out to those we love. Today marks the beginning of a national, week long campaign to educate men about their health concerns and encourage them to seek out information and preventative screenings. And that message is being heard loud and clear on Capitol Hill, where screenings will be offered to Members of Congress and their staff. Congress is setting an example, that all men should be healthy role models for their families to ensure that they live strong, healthy lives.
